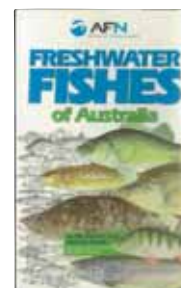


FRESHWATER FISHES OF AUSTRALIA

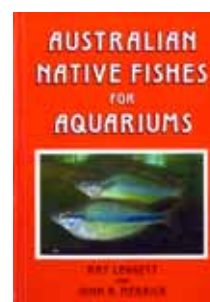
